Beavertail Grip Safety

- 1. Completely disassemble gun.
- 2. Scribe .250 radius on each side of the frame from the center of the thumb safety hole.
- 3. Remove the excess metal until the beavertail will move freely with the thumb safety installed.

NOTE: We recommend the use of our Beavertail Fitting Jig, part number 886, for a foolproof way of cutting a .250 radius with only a file. This greatly simplifies installation.

- 4. Extra stock is left on the trigger block arm for custom fitting to your trigger.
- 5. If the sharp edges of the frame and thumb safety overhang the beavertail, cut them down to form a smooth radius.
- 6. If you are using a standard hammer, its tail must be rounded to clear during functioning. The beavertail is designed for use with a Commander style hammer. We recommend our part numbers 896 and 897.
- 7. Make sure the new part will properly block the trigger and function properly before loading gun.
